Top 20 pc higher education campuses to have greater autonomy: Javadekar

Higher education institutions to be divided into 3 categories 'HRD not for diluting Indian language autonomous bodies'

THE TOP 20 per cent of higher education institutions in the country deserved more autonomy and the government would work towards exempting them from UGC's review mechanism, Union HRD Minister Prakash Javadekar told *The Indian Express* on Friday.

Javadekar used the words "trust", "free from government's clutches" and a "fund and forget" philosophy to underline the policy.

All higher education institutions, Javadekar said, will be divided into three categories, with the top 20 per cent enjoying greater academic freedom, the next 40 per cent with relatively more regulations, and the remaining 40 per cent that will remain under the UGC's regulatory control.

The top 20 per cent will be chosen on the basis of the NAAC grading system scores.

"Trust is important," Javadekar said. "Educational institutes of eminence across the world are free from government clutches. The Parliament and the government (in our country) are now following a new philosophy of fund and forget."

He said: "The top 20 per cent on the institutions will have close to 80 per cent of the academic

freedom that we have agreed to bestow on IIMs under the new IIM Bill, which is tabled in Parliament."

The plan to set up 20 world-class institutions — 10 government-run and 10 private — also fits into the above philosophy, according to Javadekar. The 20 will be known as "institutions of eminence".

"By April 2018, these 20 world-class institutions will come into being. I'm doing weekly follow-up (meetings) of all developments. The advertisement (calling for applications) will be issued this month. Meanwhile, an empowered committee will be constituted by a group that would have the cabinet secretary, higher education secretary and the UGC chairman," he said.

Javadekar said this group "will

identify five to six persons of eminence who will vet applications and choose the 20 world-class institutions... We'll give them three months for this."

The Institutions of Eminence, also mentioned by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in his Independence Day speech, will be set up through a UGC regulation that will provide an enabling architecture to them to emerge as world-class institutions as the country has little representation in international rankings.

When asked if the merger of the AICTE and UGC was part of the ministry's plan to move towards greater autonomy for educational institutions, Javadekar said there was no such proposal with the government at this moment.

'HRD not for diluting Indian language autonomous bodies'

THE HRD Ministry is not in favour of the NITI Aayog's suggestion to dilute the character of autonomous bodies set up to promote Indian languages, minister Prakash Javadekar told *The Indian Express* on Friday.

"They (the NITI Aayog) had given us a few suggestions. But we have put our point of view forward. Every language is unique. We want to promote all Indian languages. We want to preserve the unique identity of all (language) councils," he said.

Asked specifically if he wanted to preserve the unique identity of every language, Javadekar said: "Yes."

The Indian Express had reported on June 14 that the NITI Aayog had suggested a merger of the Central Institute of Classical Tamil (CICT) with the Central Institute of Indian Languages in Mysuru.

Similarly, the National Council for Promotion of Sindhi Language was recommended to be merged with the Central Institute of Indian

Languages, and the National Council for Promotion of Urdu Language with either the Maulana Azad National Urdu University or Jamia Millia Islamia.

Stalled for decades, North Koel reservoir project gets Cabinet nod

THE NORTH Koel Reservoir irrigation project, work on which had started in 1972, is likely to reach completion with the Union Cabinet allocating Rs 1,622 crore for the purpose.

Districts like Palamu and Garhwa in Jharkhand and Gaya and Aurangabad in Bihar will benefit from the project.

The Cabinet cleared the project on Wednesday. The allocated amount will be utilised over three years. Thanking the Prime Minister, Jharkhand Chief

Minister Raghubar Das said the project would be completed in about 30 months.

The breakthrough, officials said, came with the concerned agencies agreeing to reduce the Full Reservoir Level (FRL) from a proposed 367 metres to 341 metres in order to save large swathes of the Palamu Tiger Reserve (PTR) from submergence. This had been the stumbling block for the project since 1993.

The project will now have a decreased irrigation potential (IP), while the power generation component has been done away with.

"The problem with the earlier proposal of having FRL of 367

metres was that it would have led to submergence of nearly 6,000 ha of PTR, including its core areas. It is a protected area and the first tiger reserve in the country. So the forest department had objected and the matter remained unresolved since then. Now, it has been decided that the FRL will be 341 metres. This will lead to submergence of only 1,000 ha of PTR — that too in non-core areas. The number of villages affected due to submergence will come down from 13 to eight," said Divisional Forest Officer (Koel Division) and Deputy Director of PTR Anil Kumar Mishra.

Key IFFI committees changed, made leaner

THE INFORMATION and Broadcasting Ministry has reconstituted the steering committee and the technical committee for the International Film Festival of India (IFFI), one of the country's premier film festivals that will be held from November 20-28 in Goa.

The new 13-member steering committee will be headed by filmmaker Jahnur Barua as its convener.

Filmmaker and screenwriter Nagesh Kukunoor will head the technical committee, replacing senior Odia director and cinematographer A K Bir, who held the position for the last two years. The technical committee has 12 members this year compared to 18 last year.

The new steering committee is drastically different in its composition, which last year had 17 members and included more bureaucrats of the I&B Ministry, including the ministry's secretary, joint secretary

of films and director generals of DAVP, PIB, Directorate of Film Festivals (DFF). Among few people from the film world in the committee last year were filmmakers Rakesh Omprakash Mehra, Shyamaprasad and Raghavendra Rao.

Among members introduced in the steering committee this year are Praseon Joshi, recently appointed chairman of Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC); Vani Tripathi, CBFC board member who is also a member of BJP and was the party's national secretary earlier; advertising filmmaker Piyush Pandey; producer Siddharth Roy Kapur; director and cinematographer Shaji N Karun; animator Meren Imchen; director Ashwani Iyer

Tiwari among others.

Filmmaker Anand Gandhi is also a member of the new steering committee.

Sources in the ministry said that the preview committee for IFFI is also being reconstituted, although there was no official communication about it. People aware of the issue told *The Indian Express* that officials from the DFF have unofficially hinted to some members of the preview committee that it might be changed.

The preview committee was set up for three years by then I&B minister M Venkaiah Naidu last year to "maintain continuity". But since Irani took over on July 19 there has been uncertainty on the continuity of the committee.

I-DAY SPEECH

No plans to go to court, says Sarkar

TRIPURA Chief Minister Manik Sarkar on Friday said the Left Front government has no plans to go to court against Doordarshan and All India Radio for allegedly not airing his Independence Day recorded speech.

"We are not thinking of going to the court on the issue of censorship on my recorded Independence Day speech," he told reporters here.

However, he added, "...but we would go to the people and tell them about the undemocratic, autocratic and intolerant steps of Prasar Bharati."

Sarkar, also a Politbu member of CPI-M, said "as a political

activist I expressed my political statement in my Independence Day speech, because I think the day is a political event".

Meanwhile, party activists demonstrated before the Doordarshan Kendra in Agartala. CPM Central Committee member Gautam Das said "people of the state would not tolerate this undemocratic step of Prasar Bharati, which is controlled by Modi government".

Opposition Congress MLA Ratan Lal Nath said, the CPM was trying to "politicise" the issue before the assembly polls due in February next.

DU student 'molested' at Metro station, one held

New Delhi: A 22-year-old man has been arrested for allegedly molesting a Delhi University student inside the premises of a Metro station, Friday. Police said the accused, identified as Akshay Gupta (22), was picked up from Pulbangash Metro station after the woman reported the matter.

According to DCP (Metro), Pankaj Kumar Singh, the accused stated the woman, who was accompanied by her cousin, till the

Metro station. He crept up from behind and touched her inappropriately, the woman alleged.

When she confronted him, he hurled abuses but also urged her to become friends with him. "When she refused, he started to issue threats. The woman called police and he was apprehended from the spot," said an officer. The woman told police that the accused had been stalking her for the past two months. ENS
